THE PROGRAMME IN HISTORY, GEOGRAPHY AND ANTHROPOLOGY

The post-graduate in Historical, Geographical, Anthropological Studies (University of Padova, Ca' Foscari Venice and Verona) is among the first regional PhD programmes in Italy and provides a highly qualified academic and research training. It teaches specific methodologies as to investigate and foster the potential for cross-links between humanities and hard sciences. The programme aims at achieving independent research abilities.

During the first year PhD candidates start their own research programme which they will develop during the second and third year.

During the second and third year, up to 18 months can be spent abroad at partner Institutions such as the University of Paris 7 and the Faculty of History at Oxford University.

Original research results should be presented in the PhD dissertation, at the end of the third year. The thesis will be evaluated by both Italian and foreign experts.

The PhD course provides a highly international and stimulating research environment. The course enjoys a network of partnerships with the most relevant European Universities in France, the UK and Germany.

RESEARCH TOPICS

Society and cultural representations.

The study of identity and identity construction (national and international, professional, religious, racial, intergenerational), rules and law, public and private sociability. Ritual and religious practices. The history of spirituality.

Politics and its functioning.

Institutions (civil and ecclesiastical), history of communication, of public opinion, military history, colonialism and post-colonialism.

Social history and anthropology of the material and immaterial heritage.

Ethnographic museums, understanding the natural environment, the history and anthropology of the countryside (natural and semi-natural), cultural and religious transformation, the history and anthropology of cities, of migration and of the workforce.

Analysis of spatial and territorial processes.

The impact of man on the physical environment, (variations in climate and population); the historical, geographical and anthropological problems of globalization: technologies, politics, ethics.
