Brian Shaev, Leiden University

Expellees, Returnees, and Labor Migration in the Reconstruction of Dortmund

Brian Shaev is University Lecturer at the Institute for History at Leiden University. His PhD and postdoctoral research are transnational histories of social democratic parties and European integration, focusing on policy fields like free movement and migration. Currently he is principle investigator of a grant project financed by the Jan Wallanders och Tom Hedelius Stiftelse on municipal policies on migrant integration in postwar Europe, in which he studies the policies and local politics of the city of Dortmund in regards to municipal migrant integration.
